

Three of the six hires come from the federal government — two from Immigration and Customs Enforcement and one from the Justice Department — and two from state government.

The hires came in advance of meetings this week in Houston, [said](#) a meeting announcement posted Nov. 30 in the *Federal Register*.

Today the group will hold a joint meeting of FirstNet's Governance and Personnel, Finance, Technology, and Consultation and Outreach committees, which will be followed by closed sessions through the afternoon.

During a session run by FirstNet's Public Safety Advisory Committee, the committee is expected to address issues related to priority access and preemption, [according to](#) *The National Law Review*.
